Dear Friends of Holy Assumption Monastery,

Recently, one of the sisters was recounting a story about our cockatiel Morris, who died a while back. When the birds were still in the leaky aviary, the sister who takes care of the birds went in and heard a very distressed Morris. Try as she might, she could not see him. Finally, she found him in one of the buckets used for catching leaks. He had flown in, but could not get back out. The sister gently released him from his predicament, but he was very scared and therefore not overly appreciative of being rescued. As the sister remarked later, "He didn't seem very grateful!"

Sometimes we're on one side of this story and sometimes the other. Like Morris, we easily get into innocent-looking situations, only to find that we can't get back out. Scared and confused, we strike out, even at those who are trying to help. Other times, we fancy ourselves as rescuers and are surprised and offended when the other person "nips."

So, the next time we are trying to fish a friend out of the bucket, let's not be too hard on them if they nip a bit – that bucket can be a scary place! And if we get stuck in the bucket ourselves, it's good to remember that the hand reaching down is trying to help. Either way, God is in charge, and He'll effect the rescue if we just let Him!

#### SEPTEMBER FRIENDS MEETING

At our Sunday, September 9<sup>th</sup> Friends meeting, Fr. Constantine Efstathiu shared reflections on 46 years in the priesthood. Most of what he said focused on the importance of Christian community. He spoke of how there is only one priesthood - that of Christ - but that He in His love for us shares that priesthood not just with the sacramental priesthood, but with all believers. The sisters are enormously appreciative of everyone who attended and assisted with the Silent Auction & Benefit for St. Nicholas House on Sunday, September 23rd. The event took place at Holy Trinity Greek Orthodox Church on Brotherhood Way in San Francisco, and Fr. Aris Metrakos kept the crowd amused and entertained as Master of Ceremonies. Wonderful musicians from Holy Virgin Cathedral (SF), Old Holy Virgin Cathedral (SF), Holy Trinity (SF), All Saints (Rohnert Park), Sts. Peter and Paul (Santa Rosa), St. Seraphim (Santa Rosa), and All Saints of Russia (Burlingame) provided a delightful variety of sacred, folk and classical music throughout the evening. The event raised \$4,400 towards replacing the roof on St. Nicholas House. With the \$10,000 the sisters already have in the bank, this puts us well in sight of our fundraising goal of \$17,000!
