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Dear Friends of Holy Assumption Monastery,

There is an interesting Youtube video in which researchers give two Capuchin monkeys rewards for a simple task (handing the researcher a rock). At first, both monkeys willingly do the task for a cucumber slice. Then, the researcher continues to reward one monkey with a cucumber slice, but starts to reward the other monkey with a grape. The first monkey rattles the cage and throws the cucumber slices at the researcher! The video purports to show that Capuchin monkeys have a sense of fairness.

One sister remarked that if the monkeys really had a sense of fairness, the one who got the grapes would have given some to his neighbor who got only cucumber slices. That led us to think how much more often we say “That’s not fair!” when WE are the ones on the short end of the stick than when the other person is. In fact, half of the time we think we got the short end when we got the long end!

Thanks be to God that He does not treat us fairly. It is not fair that Christ died for us. It is not fair that we have been adopted by God through baptism into Christ’s death and resurrection. But God is not fair. He is Love.

Those who have been perfected in His Love move past fairness to the justice of God. Elder Paisius said that if two people are sitting in a room with ten apricots and both take five, that is human justice; but if one gives most of the apricots to the other, that is Divine justice. If we follow Divine justice, we will probably be long on cucumber slices and short on grapes, but we will be filled to overflowing with God. Not really a choice, is it?

APRIL FRIENDS MEETING

At our Sunday April 14 Friends Meeting, Nicolas Custer, helped by several members of the St. Seraphim choir, presented “A Musical Journey through Lent.” As one might suspect from the name, this “journey” was more music than lecture. Since it is not really possible to recap the presentation, we will have to content ourselves with a couple of main points and a story he told that illustrates both points. First, no matter where we are in Lent, the themes of repentance and forgiveness are present. Second, the Resurrection illumines with its own joy the sorrow and penitence of Lent.

The story is about an old Russian woman. She was waiting in a long line for confession. Finally her turn came. Using two canes to walk, she hobbled to the priest and told him that she would soon die, but that God could never forgive her. She explained that she had worked in the concentration camps and had treated the prisoners very badly – going so far as to throw the bones of the dead to her dogs. When she repeated that God could never forgive her, the priest said, “Let’s start a step back and ask the forgiveness of the people here.” So, the woman repeated what she had told the priest, telling the people that it was their parents, grandparents, and priests whom she had treated this way. Then, everyone in the church knelt down and said, “God forgive you, Mother. Forgive us.” The priest gave her absolution. She came back the next day for Liturgy, received communion, and died that very day. Word got around and thousands of people came to her funeral.

If we journey through Lent with a tenth of such repentance and forgiveness, we will know the joy of the Resurrection in the profoundest way.
