Dear Friends of Holy Assumption Monastery,

As many of you know, quiet little Calistoga was shaken up in mid-July when the alleged robbers of an armored truck in nearby Windsor were spotted in town. The first man was quickly apprehended, but the whole town was instructed to shelter in place for over four hours, until the second man was found.

Most of the sisters were home when this occurred, but three of us were out in Santa Rosa on errands and advised not to return until the situation was resolved. All of us were acutely aware of our own powerlessness. Those at home knew that our doors wouldn't stop determined men with guns, and we who were away knew there was nothing we could do for our sisters who were sheltering in place.

These four hours gave us a tiny glimpse of the lives of our brothers and sisters in strife-ravaged inner cities, war-torn countries, etc. where worse occurrences happen every day. How do they bear it? No doubt, some bear it better than others, and sadly, some are crushed under the burden. But out of the worst persecution comes story after story of persecuted Christians who have found peace in the midst of nightmarish circumstances and have freely forgiven those responsible. Deprived of the illusory peace that this world offers, they have found the unshakeable peace of God.

So, here we are in Calistoga, with life back to normal, while so many of our persecuted brethren likely will never experience "normal" again. Certainly, we must pray that peace return to their ravaged lands. But let us not forget the lesson that they so eloquently teach us – that the only peace worth having is the one that even death can't take away.
