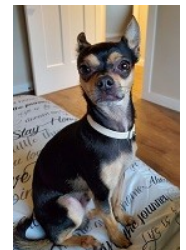
ZOO UPDATE – Hello and Goodbye

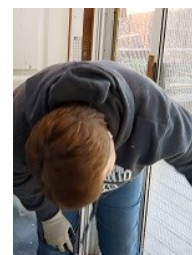

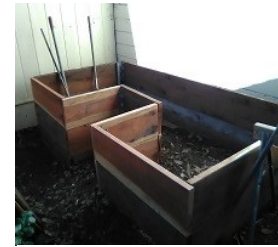
